



Responsibilities of a Participant of the International Tankard

An International Tankard participant is a curling club member whose volunteer efforts have furthered the sport of curling and has been nominated by the curling club to take part in the events of the International Tankard.

Responsibilities International Tankard Participants are:

- * When the event is held in an American City, to have a Canadian Passport.
- * To make their own arrangements for accommodation in the host city. (May wish to use the suggested accommodation).
- * To advise the International Tankard Committee if extra dinner tickets are required. (Extra tickets may be purchased at the Friday Night Social).
- * Suggest to bring three club pins for trading with their counterpart of the opposing team. (May bring more if the participant wishes to do more pin trading).
- * To attend the Friday Evening Social at the host curling club. This usually commences approximately at 7:00PM Friday.
- * BC participants will be placed on a team by the Region 11 Committee however, once the four curlers of the team have introduced themselves, it will be up to the team to decide which position each curler plays.
- * To participate in the Opening Ceremonies on Saturday.
- * Each curler will play three games during the event. (Generally two on Saturday and one on Sunday).
- * To attend the Saturday Night Banquet.
- * To participate in the Closing Ceremonies on Sunday.
- * To meet new friends, to reacquaint with old friends and to exchange ideas that may improve the curling world.
- * To drive to the event and return home safely.
